<b>SITE</b>	The Upper Valley Aquatic Center ( <a href="http://www.uvacswim.org">www.uvacswim.org</a> ) competition pool is an 11 lane, 25-yard pool with 7-foot-wide lanes and non-turbulent lane lines. The timing system includes a fully-automatic Colorado TimingSystem with touchpads at the finish end of the pool and an alphanumeric display scoreboard. There are no touchpads at the turn end of the pool. The start end of the pool is 7 feet deep, the turn end of the pool is 9 feet deep. Eight lanes will be used for competition. At least one lane will be available for warm-up/warm-down during the meet. If needed, ten lanes will be used for competition and then three warm-up/warm-down lanes will be available in Splash Park lap pool. The pool is located at 100 Arboretum Lane, White River Junction, VT 05001. Directions may be found later in this document. The competition course has been certified in accordance with 104.2.2C(4). [The copy of such certification is on file with USA Swimming.]
<b>FORMAT:</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>● The meet will be swum as timed finals. The session will be seeded during warm-ups. Heat sheets will be given to coaches and posted on the pool deck.</li> <li>● DISTANCE EVENTS: will be seeded slow to fast. Timing will be assigned to teams for the entirety of the Friday evening session.</li> <li>● No events will swim with more than one swimmer per lane</li> <li>● 25 yard events will start at the start end and be timed with a button and two watches.</li> <li>● All teams will be assigned jobs based on the number of swimmers each session.</li> </ul>

<b>SCRATCHES</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Scratches will be collected before the meet and up until 20 minutes within the first warm-ups. Session will be seeded after scratches are received.</li> </ul>
<b>COURSE</b>	SCY
<b>ELIGIBILITY</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Coaches are responsible for ensuring all swimmers are fully registered with USA Swimming including proof of age on file.</li> <li>All swimmers must be currently registered as athlete members of United States Swimming before 5:00 pm on the day before the first day of the meet (Thursday March 14). New England swimmers must have a proof of age on file by the above deadline in order to compete</li> <li>Age is determined by the age of the swimmer on the first day of the meet.</li> <li>Any swimmer entered in the meet must be certified by a USA Swimming member-coach as being proficient in performing a racing start or must start each race from within the water without the use of the backstroke ledge. When unaccompanied by a member-coach, it is the responsibility of the swimmer or the swimmer's legal guardian to ensure compliance with this requirement.</li> <li>Coaches must be registered before the start of the meet.</li> <li>If a swimmer who is not properly registered with USA Swimming competes in a sanctioned competition, the host LSC will impose a fine of up to \$100.00 per event against the individual, member coach, or a member club submitting the entry.</li> <li>Deck registrations will NOT be accepted.</li> </ul>
<b>DISABILITY SWIMMERS</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Athletes with a disability are welcome and shall provide advance notice of desired accommodations to the Meet Director.</li> <li>The athlete (or the athlete's coach) is also responsible for notifying the session referee of any disability prior to the competition.</li> </ul>
<b>ENTRY POLICY</b>	<p>NHSA teams only</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Teams that are members of the New Hampshire Swim Association are eligible to participate in this meet. Unattached swimmers may only participate in the meet if they are associated with one of the participating teams (recent transfer in or out of the team). Unattached swimmers will not score points and cannot participate in relays.</li> </ul>
<b>CUT PROTOCOL</b>	<p>If a session is over-subscribed, the Meet Director reserves the right to limit events, heats, swimmers, or adjust the format to conform to the 4-hour rule using the following cut protocols in any order deemed necessary:</p> <p>(a.) Bonus events will be cut</p> <p>(b.) Teams may be asked to cut the number of relays within an event.</p>
<b>ENTRIES</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Electronic entries should be emailed as an attachment to the entry chairperson. Please check that your team's name, address, and contact information are listed correctly in this file. For email entries, payment and hardcopy of the entry (including signed entry cover page and waiver) must be received by: March 15, 2025. Failure to pay entry fees by this deadline could result in teams being barred from the meet.</li> <li><b>Entry fee checks should be payable to NHSA</b></li> <li>Preference is to then bring the check and completed waiver to the meet. If need to mail the check, then mail waiver and payment to Mary Gentry: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Mary Gentry</li> <li>Upper Valley Aquatic Center</li> <li>PO Box 1198</li> <li>White River Junction, VT 05001</li> <li>(Physical address is 100 Arboretum Lane, White River Junction VT 05001 for non-USPS deliveries)</li> </ul> </li> <li>Any team that fails to send payment, cover page and waiver form, by the entry due date may be scratched from the meet and may be assessed a \$100 fine at the discretion of the Entry Chairperson. If no payment is received after 30 days, the fine is doubled. This fine is payable to the Upper Valley Aquatic Club. Late payment of entry fees may result in future exclusion from meets hosted by our club.</li> <li><b>IMPORTANT:</b> If payment is sent via Express Mail/FedEx/Airborne/UPS/etc., please ensure that a signature is NOT required for delivery.</li> </ul>

	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Entries will be acknowledged within 48 hours of the first date of entry if they are accepted into the meet. <i>Your entry is considered received only if you receive an acknowledgement.</i></li> <li>• All unattached swimmers must be declared as unattached, on the entry cover sheet, before the meet begins.</li> <li>• All entry times must be entered in the specified meet course. (Coach's times should be used instead of NT's)</li> <li>• Athletes may enter and swim in a maximum of 3 individual events, 1 medley relay, and 1 free relay. (see next sections about Bonus Events and Relays)</li> <li>• <b>ENTRY TIME UPDATES:</b> Entry times may be updated until the Monday prior to the first day of the meet. No new entries will be accepted after the entry deadline. Entry time updates should be sent via email to the entry chairperson at <a href="mailto:uvac.entries@gmail.com">uvac.entries@gmail.com</a> . Entry time updates must be sent as Hy-Tek format CL2 files with updated times.</li> <li>• No deck entries will be accepted.</li> </ul>
<b>BONUS (exhibition) EVENTS</b>	11-12, 13-14, and 15-19 year old swimmers will be allowed to swim one bonus event. These events will NOT be scored and must be noted on the entry as Exhibition Events with an "Exh". If this is not noted as described then the last events entered (over the 3 that a swimmer can swim) will be noted as Bonus Events and will NOT be scored. Bonus events are optional.
<b>RELAYS</b>	Swimmers may participate in one medley relay and one free relay. Notice that in the events file there is overlap in the relay age groups for teams to have a broader group of swimmers eligible for a particular relay. E.g., there are 11-14 relays in the 13-14 age group session and 13-19 relays in the 15-19 session. (Similar to allowing 13-14 swimmers to age up and participate in a 15-19 relay.) <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Dual Human Confirmation of relay take off violations will be required at all New England Swimming meets.</li> <li>• Each team is allowed an unlimited number of relay entries in an event but only the top two finishers can score points and receive awards.</li> <li>• Relays entries and seed times must be included in the meet entries file. Swimmer names for the relays may change up to the start of the event. Relay cards with swimmers' names and order will be turned in to the computer table (if different than what is submitted with entries).</li> <li>• All relay swimmers must be officially entered into the meet.</li> </ul> Unattached swimmers may not participate in any relays.
<b>TIME TRIALS</b>	Time trials will be offered at the discretion of the Meet Director and the Meet Referee if time allows.
<b>FEES</b>	\$43.00 per swimmer including relay only swimmers. This includes fees for events, relays, swimmer participation and NES Travel Fee. \$10.00 for time trials Non-electronic entries: \$45.00 per swimmer. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Make check payable to <b>NHSA</b>.</li> </ul>
<b>TEAM WORK Assignments</b>	Team work assignments will be distributed to all teams by the end of day Tuesday before the meet. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Assignments will also be posted on the <a href="https://www.nhsaswim.org/2025-state-meet/">https://www.nhsaswim.org/2025-state-meet/</a> site</li> </ul>
<b>ADMISSIONS</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• No charge for admission</li> <li>• Heat sheets \$3 per session</li> </ul>
<b>MEET MOBILE</b>	<b>MEET MOBILE:</b> Meet Mobile will be functional for this meet, (dependent upon satisfactory internet access) All users should be aware that Meet Mobile publishes unverified raw data that may not always be accurate. Meet name is 2025 NHSA State Championships.
<b>LIVE STREAM</b>	A live stream of the meet will be available through the UVAC LiveBarn subscription program. <a href="http://www.livebarn.com">www.livebarn.com</a> Venue is Upper Valley Aquatic Center. <b>WARM-UP</b>	The pool will open for warm-ups 60 minutes before the start of the meet as designated on the event list. Teams will have assigned warm-up lanes for 20 minutes. The pool will close five minutes before the beginning of each session. Teams will be assigned warm-up lanes after all entries are received. At least one lane will be available for warm-up/warm-down during the meet. <b>See "Safety" for Warm-up safety guidelines.</b>
<b>AWARDS</b>	Swimmers will be given medals for 1 <sup>st</sup> through 8 <sup>th</sup> place in individual and 1 <sup>st</sup> through 3 <sup>rd</sup> for relay events. Ribbons will be awarded for 9 <sup>th</sup> through 16 <sup>th</sup> places in individual events and 4 <sup>th</sup> through 8 <sup>th</sup>

	places in relay events. A team representative will pick up all awards at the conclusion of the meet on Sunday. Heat winner ribbons will be awarded at the end of each heat. Banners will be awarded to the top teams.																																																			
<b>SCORING</b>	An unlimited number of individual swimmers can score in an event. Only two relays per team can score in an event. 15-19 age group individual events will be swum together but scored separately for 15-16 year olds and 17-19 year olds.

<b>LEGAL SPLITS</b>	<p><b>Individual Events:</b> Preferably, legal splits should be requested before the event, by a coach, using a legal split form (available from the Control Table) and the requesting party should supply an additional timer(s) on the lane for the split, if necessary, to ensure an accurate time. (1 timer with touchpad timing, 3 timers without touchpad timing). Timers must be positioned over the lane at the end of the racing course. Optionally, a legal split may be requested after the event using a legal split form when using a fully automatic timing system. The Admin Official has discretion to either grant or deny the request after reviewing the available evidence. Backstroke legal splits must be requested in advance to ensure a legal finish.</p> <p><b>LEGAL SPLITS – Relays:</b> All lead-off splits for relays are automatically loaded into SWIMS and do not require additional watches for validation unless there are no touchpads present, or the second swimmer starts in the water. If there are no touchpads, or the second swimmer starts in the water, a legal split form with three watches will be required for entry into SWIMS. Timers must be positioned over the lane at the end of the racing course. It is recommended that coaches report lead-off time discrepancies to the Administrative Referee or Administrative Official.</p>																																																			
<b>SWIMWEAR</b>	Per USA Swimming rules (102.8.1.F), 12 & Under swimmers may not wear a Technical Suit at any Sanctioned, Approved, or Observed meet. The age of the swimmer is determined on the first day of the meet. Guidance on identifying compliant and non-compliant suits can be found on the USA Swimming website under <a href="#">Tech Suit Restriction for 12-and-Under Swimmers</a> .																																																			
<b>RULES</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• The current USA Swimming Rules and Regulations including the Minor Athlete Abuse Protection Policy will govern this meet.</li> <li>• Operation of a <b>DRONE</b>, or any other flying apparatus, is prohibited over the venue (pools, athlete/coach areas, spectator areas and open ceiling locker rooms) any time athletes, coaches, officials and/or spectators are present without written USA Swimming approval.</li> <li>• Use of audio or visual recording devices, including cell phones, is not permitted in changing areas, rest rooms or locker rooms. In addition, photography behind the blocks is <u>not permitted</u>.</li> <li>• <b>PHOTOGRAPHY:</b> As per New England Swimming policy, professional photographers contracted by the Upper Valley Aquatic Club, or press photographers who have been approved in advance by the Meet Director, are allowed on deck. Use of audio or visual recording devices, including a cell phone, is not permitted behind the starting blocks, including in any spectator area behind the starting blocks, nor in any other marked NO CAMERA ZONE, including on deck. All NO CAMERA ZONES will be clearly designated. Email the Meet Director with questions and requests.</li> <li>• <b>VIDEO STREAMING:</b> All video streaming must be approved in advance by the Meet Director. Any such video stream must conform to all current Safe Sport policies defined by USA Swimming, New England Swimming, and the Meet Host. No video stream may originate from behind the starting blocks or from any other area marked as a NO CAMERA ZONE. UVAC offers a live stream of the meet via LiveBarn. <a href="http://www.livebarn.com">www.livebarn.com</a></li> <li>• Deck Changing is <b>PROHIBITED</b>.</li> <li>• An athlete suspected of sustaining a concussion or exhibiting signs of a concussion, will immediately be removed from competition and shall not return to competition that day. The athlete may return to competition on a subsequent day, but only with a release authorization signed by a licensed healthcare provider.</li> <li>• According to New England Swimming Best Practices, all athletes should shower before entering the pool.</li> </ul>																																																			

	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>● In accordance with New England Swimming Policy, only those coaches who have current, valid USA Swimming credentials will be permitted to act in a coaching capacity at this meet. Coaches with expired or non-current credentials will be required to leave the deck area.</li> </ul>
<b>SAFETY</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>● No shaving is permitted at the competition site.</li> <li>● No glass containers are permitted within the facility.</li> <li>● Swimmers must be under the supervision of a coach. If a swimmer arrives at the meet without a coach, the swimmer should notify the referee before he/she warms up. The referee will assign the swimmer to a registered coach for warm-ups.</li> <li>● Any injuries or need for medical attention should be reported to the facility lifeguards. An AED is available in the facility lobby.</li> <li>● <a href="#">UVAC-Evacuation-Policy</a> and list of local health care facilities</li> </ul> <p><b>WARM UP SAFETY:</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>● Diving will be prohibited during warm-ups except in specifically announced one-way sprint lanes. There will be no diving in the warm-up and warm-down areas at any time</li> <li>● For all warm-up sessions, swimmers must utilize a “sit and slide”/“three-point” entry to enter the pool for warm-ups, by first sitting on the deck, and then sliding, feet-first, into the pool.</li> <li>● During competition, when entering the warm-up/warm-down area, a “sit and slide”/“three-point” entry is required at all times</li> </ul>
<b>SAFE SPORT</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>● The USA Swimming Safe Sport program is USA Swimming’s comprehensive abuse prevention program dedicated to creating a healthy and positive environment free from abuse for all its members. Components of the program include, but are not limited to, providing education and training, enforcing policies (such as the Minor Athlete Abuse Prevention Policy), rules and best practice guidelines, promoting healthy boundaries and mandatory reporting of violations.</li> <li>● The Minor Athlete Abuse Prevention Policy (<a href="http://www.usaswimming.org/maapp">www.usaswimming.org/maapp</a>) prohibits Adult Participants (as defined) from having one-on-one interactions with minor athletes which are not within an observable and interruptible distance from another adult participant. Adult Participants are required to abide by this policy in full during this meet.</li> <li>● Pursuant to USA Swimming Rules and Regulations and federal law, it is every member’s responsibility to immediately (i.e., within 24 hours) report any incident of child abuse, including physical or sexual abuse, to law enforcement and the U.S. Center for SafeSport. Reporting must occur when an individual has firsthand knowledge of misconduct or where specific and credible information has been received from a victim or knowledgeable third party. A report to the U.S. Center for SafeSport may be made via telephone at 833-5US-SAFE (833-587-7233) or online at <a href="http://www.uscenterforsafesport.org/report-a-concern">www.uscenterforsafesport.org/report-a-concern</a>. Various state laws may also require reporting to law enforcement or to a designated child protection agency.</li> <li>● For information on how to report other alleged violations, including without limitation, the USA Swimming Code of Conduct and the Minor Athlete Abuse Prevention Policy, please visit <a href="http://www.usaswimming.org/report">www.usaswimming.org/report</a>.</li> <li>● All athletes age 18 and older must complete Athlete Protection Training in order to be a USA Swimming registered member in good standing. Any athlete who turns 18 on or before 03/15/25, who has not completed Athlete Protection Training by the first day of competition, will be prohibited from participating in the competition until such time as all membership requirements are completed. Times achieved by an athlete who turns age 18 on or before 03/15/25 who competes in this USA Swimming sanctioned event without completing this membership requirement, will NOT count for qualification or recognition. This includes participation as a member of a relay.</li> </ul>
<b>FACILITY RULES</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>● Day passes are available for purchase to use other parts of the facility during the meet. Information and rules are available at <a href="#">UVAC Day Passes</a></li> </ul>
<b>CHANGES TO MEET</b>	<p>Once a meet is sanctioned, changes can be made to the meet invitation before the meet, only with the approval of the Technical Chair, <a href="#">Patrick Johnstone</a>. Any change to the meet format after the meet begins will be at the discretion of the Meet Referee and will be presented to the coaches at a coaches meeting.</p>

<b>WEATHER/ FACILITY PROTOCOL</b>	If weather or facility conditions make it impossible to follow the original timeline of events, the Meet Director and Meet Referee have a right to make changes to the meet sessions. The Meet Director will notify the teams of the changes with as much notice as possible. Cancellation of the meet, or a session, is the decision of the Meet Director, Meet Referee and the Meet Jury.
<b>MEET JURY</b>	The Meet Jury will be made up of the Meet Director, Steve VanderBeken, John DiCaprio, and Brian Crawford. The Meet Referee who will present issues and moderate the Meet Jury but not vote. The Meet Jury will decide all issues of eligibility, and anything not addressed in the Meet Announcement. The Meet Referee shall have authority as described in the current USA Swimming Rulebook.
<b>DECK ACCESS</b>	Only current USA Swimming registered athletes, coaches, officials, and official meet staff are permitted on the pool deck. All non-athletes on the pool deck must produce proof of their valid USA Swimming registration when asked. Deck Pass is an acceptable proof of membership. Individuals without proof of a valid membership in USA Swimming will be removed from the pool deck and will be fined by New England Swimming of \$100 to the coach, and \$200 to the coach's club.
<b>OFFICIALS</b>	Officials that know they will be attending the meet are highly encouraged to email the Meet Referee and let them know your level of certification, team, and sessions you will be available. Walk-on officials may not be accepted to limit the number of people on the deck. The Officials' meetings will be at 45 minutes prior to the start of a session in Hospitality.
<b>GENERAL</b>	<b>FOOD:</b> There will be a small concession stand in the Lobby for this meet. Coach and Officials hospitality will be available at the meet. <b>VENDORS:</b> There will be a t-shirt/clothing vendor and a suit/equipment vendor at this meet. <b>PARKING:</b> There will be a daily/weekend fee to part on-site. The free shuttle bus service will be available to the off-site free parking lot at Mascoma Bank at 243 Sykes Mountain Ave.

<b>HOTELS</b>	Chain hotels in White River Junction VT or Lebanon/West Lebanon NH include Holiday Inn Express, Super 8, Best Western, Hilton Garden, Quality Inn, Residence Inn, and Courtyard Inn. <b>WAIVERS</b>	USA Swimming, Inc., New England Swimming, Inc., New Hampshire Swim Association, the Upper Valley Aquatic Center, and the Upper Valley Aquatic Club cannot prevent you (or your children) from becoming exposed to, contracting, or spreading COVID-19 while participating in USA Swimming/New England Swimming sanctioned events.
